Be Gracious

You do your best each day to teach your children about responsibility. It's very healthy to let your children experience what happens naturally if they are not responsible (as long as their safety is not in jeopardy of course). If they forget things they are supposed to take to school for example, let them discover how to deal with the consequences of their forgetfulness. Give them continual age-appropriate opportunities for responsibility at home like making their bed, putting away toys, helping to prepare dinner, or taking care of pets.

Knowing that they are expected to be responsible at home and at school is a very important life lesson for our children. If they grumble about little inconveniences like wearing a mask, help them understand that thinking about the needs of others and not only of ourselves is a truly gracious way to live. And when your child makes a mistake, the "OWN UP" strategy is a beautiful faithful way to help them learn to be accountable for their actions.

Faith & Family

Parents are the primary educator of their children. Did you realize that when you teach your sons and daughters about their responsibilities at home and in their community, you are helping them learn about



an important Catholic Social Teaching? Learn more about rights and responsibilities by watching this video. Consider hanging this poster on your fridge or in your child's room and have conversations about the Catholic Social Teachings often. Here is a child's version and here is one for your teens. Home + School + Parish = Partners in Catholic Education!

Be Grateful

We always work with our children to teach them to look for the blessings that come during difficult times. The pandemic has been challenging for all and we rejoice at the promise of the coming vaccines. While we are waiting for our turn to receive them, we know that we must continue to practice the safety protocols to protect ourselves and others in our community.

This is actually a good time to also practice gratitude. We are blessed to live in a country where we can turn on a tap and have clean water to wash our hands. Many others in the world do not have that luxury so let us be thankful for that. During those 20 seconds when we lather up, let's also be thankful for the soap we use and the wonder of our hands themselves. Consider teaching your children to make a sacred ritual of washing their hands, welcoming the opportunity to meditate on these blessings and give thanks. And it's always a good time to say their prayers too.

It's an important lesson for children to learn - that life is not all about them and their needs. Be protectors of God's gifts!" What a beautiful reminder for our families as we enter this new year!

RE-REGISTRATION STARTS FEBRUARY 1, 2021

Families who already have students in our system should expect an email on February 1, 2021 asking you to complete the online "Registration Update Form" for all of your children.

This update allows us to makes sure the information on file is accurate and that any legal declarations, preferences and consents are renewed. It also allows our schools to plan for the upcoming school year.

Parents/guardians who are hoping to register younger sibilings new to the division will also have the opportunity to do this at the same time as they re-register older students.

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION STARTS FEBRUARY 22, 2021

Students new to the division who wish to enroll for the 2021/2022 school year are invited to register online starting on February 22, 2020.

- Our Kindergarten is designed for children 5 years of age on, or before, December 31, 2021.
