Principals Message April 2022

April begins with the issuing of our second report cards – Friday, April 1. Please review these with your child, and see if they fully understand how an assessment was made. Additional clarification can often be found via the comments, whether these have been provided for each subject or more generally in the homeroom comments. These assessments may provide an excellent opportunity to set new goals for the end of the school year. We will also be sponsoring two evenings to 'meet' with your child's teacher to discuss his/her progress – Wednesday, April 6, and Thursday, April 7. Appointments can be made via the Conference Manager, which opens up on Friday, April 1, and closes the following Tuesday. Please note that we will be accepting in-person interviews from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m., and on-line interviews from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m.

It is also in the first full week of April that we will be encouraging students to recognize the significance of two days: Autism Awareness, April 4 (students and staff will be encouraged to wear blue), and Green Shirt Day, April 7. Students are encouraged to wear a green shirt to remember the four-year anniversary of a tragedy that impacted our nation, the Humboldt Broncos bus tragedy. We will be remembering how our community was able to come together in prayer to offer support for all those who were impacted by this tragedy, and to remember and pray for all those who have to deal with difficult situations in their lives.

The following week will be a shortened week as we begin the Easter break on Friday, April 15, Good Friday. Fundamental to our faith is the understanding that Jesus Christ died for our sins and was risen from the dead – the Resurrection. The Easter season reminds us of the sacrifices that Jesus made for all humanity. While through the season of Lent students were reminded to fast (fast from those things that separate us from God's love), to give alms (to give generously to others) and to pray (pray always and pray all ways), at Easter we are reminded to rejoice. We need to rejoice in all that God has done for us, and to be grateful for all that we have.

Please remember that the Easter break goes from April 15 to April 24, 2022. Students' first day back is Monday, April 25. I am hoping that everyone can enjoy a most blessed break, surrounded by loved ones and rejoicing in all that is good!

COVID UPDATE:



St. Kateri Tekakwitha School: Father Leonard Van Tighem



St. Kateri was born in 1656 in what is today the state of New York. Her mother had lived with French settlers near Trois-Rivieres, Quebec, and had become Christian. When Kateri was young, smallpox struck her village. She lost her family and was scarred as a result, with her eyesight also severely affected. Her community was visited by the Jesuits, and she would meditate often on their teachings.

At the age of 19, Kateri was baptized by a Jesuit missionary. St. Kateri prayed and fasted deeply, and had a special dedication to Mass and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Eventually, St. Kateri moved to what is today Kahnawake, Quebec. She refused marriage in order to dedicate her life to God. While there, she received her first Communion in 1677, and served her new village by teaching prayers to children, attending daily Mass, and watching over the elderly and sick. She died in 1680, just before her 24th birthday.

Many healings are attributed to Kateri's intercession. One noteworthy miracle involves a young boy from Washington state who was healed from a flesh-eating bacteria in 2012.

The Eucharist


"It is called Eucharist, because it is an action of thanksgiving to God." (CCC, no. 1328)



Eucharist "makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Savior." (CCC, no. 1330)

The Holy Eucharist is a sacrament and a sacrifice. In the Holy Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine, the Lord Christ is contained, offered, and received.

The word "Eucharist" means "Thanksgiving." Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper with his disciples, the night before He died. He took bread, blessed and broke it, and giving it to His disciples, said: "Take and eat; this is My body;" then He took a cup of wine, blessed it, and giving it to them, said: "All of you drink of this; for this is My blood of the new covenant which is being shed for many unto the forgiveness of sins;" finally, He gave His disciples the commission: "Do this in remembrance of Me." (Luke 22:19)

WEEK ONE

Kateri may have had fond memories of her prayerful Catholic mother and the stories of faith that her mother shared with her in early childhood. These would have remained indelibly impressed upon her mind and heart and were to give shape and direction to her life's destiny. Thank God today for the person who first showed you the love of Jesus.

WEEK TWO

At baptism, Tekakwitha took the name Kateri, after St. Catherine of Siena. Is there a saint that you identify with? Ask them (the saint chosen for you at your baptism and the saint you may have chosen at your confirmation) to pray for you. Maybe get a prayer card with that saint and pray the prayer on the back each day.



WEEK FOUR

Kateri was taken home to be with Jesus just before her 24th birthday. Her last words were, "Jesus, Mary, I love you." Fifteen minutes after her death, her smallpox scars disappeared and her face took on an incredibly beautiful appearance. The beauty of Kateri's soul shone through her body. What are the priorities in your life? Do you pay as much attention to the beauty of your soul as to the beauty of your body? Pray this prayer...

Dear God.


Please help me have the courage to let the light of Jesus shine brightly, no matter what is going on around me. I want to be a light for you, and honour you in all that I do. Amen

Re-Registration Starts January 17, 2022

Families who already have students in our system should expect an email during the week of January 17-21, 2022 asking that the online "Registration Update Form" be completed for each child who will be attending during the 2022/2023 school year.

This update allows us to make sure the information on file is accurate and that any legal declarations, preferences and consents are renewed. It also allows our schools to plan for the upcoming school year.

Parents/guardians who are hoping to register younger siblings new to the division will also have the opportunity to do this at the same time that they re-register older students.

New Student Registration Starts February 1, 2022

Students new to the division who wish to enroll for the 2022/2023 school year are invited to register online starting on February 1, 2022.

- Our Kindergarten is designed for children 5 years of age on, or before, December 31, 2022.


Your first step will be to go to our website and click on the at the top right - This is the PowerSchool Parent Portal.


