C. Contextual Information Surrounding 2022-2023 and the Impact on Data

A school's data is impacted by what is going on in the greater community, the city, the zone and the province. These survey results are representative of the first full year of school without exceptions due to Covid-19. Ecole St. Mary (ESM) was able to return to regular programming and mixing of cohorts that had been available pre-pandemic.

- -Cocurricular returned. ESM had running club, volleyball, basketball, badminton programs. We resumed After School Skating, and Science Sizzle. Leadership Club took place on Mondays. There was Games Club, Art Club, Boys and Girls club.
- -Provincial Achievement Exams (PAT's) were completed by grade 6 students for the first time in several years, after having several years of disruption to learning. There were no PAT's for the 2020 and 2021 school years.
- -The Accountability Report is completed by parents/guardians, certificated staff and students in January.
- -Accountability Ratings had 65 Respondents overall, 7 parents, 41 students and 17 teachers. This is a small sample size of respondents which impacts findings. Grade 4 parents are surveyed (7 out of 60+ families.)
- -It is certain that the return to cocurricular, clubs and activities certainly impacted results positively.
- -Field Trips resumed and new events and activities commenced.
- -Learning disruptions in the 2020, 2021, into the 2022 school years will continue to impact learning and especially PAT results.
- -New Curriculum for grade 1,2 and 3 was implemented in the 2022-2023 school year.



Comment on Results: In four areas of Assurance Measures, Ecole St. Mary (ESM) maintains a VERY HIGH achievement with an overall rating of Excellent. ESM is above Alberta and at a VERY HIGH achievement level in Student Learning, Citizenship, Education Quality, Welcoming and Caring Schools, Parental Involvement. There was an increase in the area of Parental involvement. Overall, we are proud to celebrate that there is an increase in all current results as compared to the previous year and the previous three-year average.



Comment on Results: Students had not written PATs in over two years. We are proud that the data from PATs in June 2022 is consistent with achievement prior to COVID. The results are consistently improving. It will be some time before we return to pre-Covid success, but the results are slightly increased or consistent with previous results.
