Holy Spirit Catholic School Division is committed to building up the kingdom of God, and creating Christ-centred learning communities where students are cherished and achieve their potential. In this year's faith plan, Build! Pilgrims of Hope, we are reflecting on the passage from Nehemiah 2:18:

I told them that the hand of my God had been gracious upon me, and also the words that the king had spoken to me. Then they said, "Let us start building!" So they committed themselves to the common good.

As part of our common commitment to putting our gifts at the service of the common good, and our examination of Catholic Social Teachings and the Corporal Works of Mercy this year, we have partnered with Chalice in building a new classroom block for St. Odilia School in Zambia.

St. Odilia School is a Catholic school run by the Sisters of the Child Jesus. Chalice, the Canadian Catholic child sponsorship organization, has been supporting St. Odilia since 2011 as part of their Kawambwa sponsor site. Over that time, Chalice has installed water and solar power in the school, launched a robust school farm, and supported their campus meal program.

Hundreds of Chalice sponsored students attend St. Odilia, as it is one of very few schools in Zambia that serves children with visual impairments, physical disabilities, and albinism. Enrollment is increasing yearly, which means that the school's infrastructure cannot accommodate all of their students comfortably nor offer all of the programs that would support the needs of their students. Our project seeks to build a new classroom block of three classrooms and two offices that would support present students and allow future growth. 



St. Dominic Savio, April 2, 1842 (Feast Day: May 6)

 ${
m Proclaim!}$ Domenico Savio was born into a large family in rural Italy in 1842, and from a young age was keenly interested in his Christian upbringing, attending Mass and receiving special Pilgrims of permission to receive the Eucharist. He was a hard worker at school, and to continue his education at age ten, began walking about five kilometers each way to the school at Castelnuovo. It was here that he would eventually meet St. John Bosco, with whom he then returned to Turin. He resolved during this time to become a saint, and experimented with various penances that he thought would assist with this goal. John Bosco, upon hearing of this, forbade it and recommended that Dominic focus on his studies and duties, doing all to the best of his abilities, which led Dominic to say "I can't do big things but I want everything to be for the glory of God." He continued to work diligently at school, to pray frequently and fervently, and sought to be a good example to his classmates

In the spring of 1857, at the age of 14, Dominic became ill, passing in March. Don Bosco wrote a short biography of Dominic, which led to his increasing popularity despite his young age at death. Due to his heroic virtue, he was canonized in 1954, and until 2017 was the youngest non-martyr saint in the Catholic church. You can learn more about him by watching one of these short videos:

The Nicene Creed uses here the words 'I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. These four marks are actually quite significant, and perhaps help us to understand this section more clearly. They are calls to action that animate our lives, not just a passive mention of the Church. Our word Church comes from the Greek word kyriakon, derived from Kyrios - 'something belonging to the Lord' or ekklesia - 'an assembly of people called forth.' After Vatican II, we often refer to the Church as the 'People of God." That's all of us!

So, we are called to belong, with one another, to the Lord, to follow the path set out by the apostles, to find our holiness in the Church, and to be one and universal in our outlook. As we seek to become Pilgrims of Hope this year, let us continue to contemplate the Creed, and how our proclamation of the Creed unites us to one another and to all Christians through time and space.

"Proclaiming" In Our Schools

The Jubilee Prayer: English | French | Spanish

Inside the overall Jubilee year, there are a variety of specific celebrations that are occurring on the calendar. It is exciting this month that we have two celebrations that are specifically pertinent in our schools. From April 25-27, there will be a jubilee of teenagers that will culminate with the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis. This will be followed on April 28-29 with the jubilee of people with disabilities. Given these two celebrations, it might be a good time this month to review Christus Vivit - Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation to and about young people, which was the response of the Holy Father to the 2018 Synod on "Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment" which laid a new foundation for the Catholic Church's current work with youth and young adults. We have embedded this into this current faith plan, so some of it will likely sound familiar to you! In the upcoming Easter season, we might for instance revisit the message at the outset, which are words of great encouragement to us:

Christ is alive! He is our hope, and in a wonderful way he brings youth to our world, and everything he touches becomes young, new, full of life. The very first words, then, that I would like to say to every young Christian are these: Christ is alive and he wants you to be alive! He is in you, he is with you and he never abandons you. However far you may wander, he is always there, the Risen One. He calls you and he waits for you to return to him and start over again. When you feel you are growing old out of sorrow, resentment or fear, doubt or failure, he will always be there to restore your strength and your hope.
