    - 2. Grade 2 students went on their retreat day at All Saints Parish and had a fantastic time. They had a chance to learn, reflect, and enjoy some delicious food thanks to the Catholic Women's League. They even brought back a decoration for our chapel to remember the experience!
  - ii. Moving into March:
    - 1. Shrove Tuesday was a huge success! Our amazing volunteers, staff, and School Council members worked hard to make pancakes and sausages for the students and staff. The food got great reviews, and a big thank you goes out to St. Francis for letting us use their space to cook. We are so grateful to all the volunteers who made it happen!
